COMMUNITY MEETING FOR PARENTS

Thank you to those of you who attended our parent community meeting on the 5th March This is a 'Levelling Up' project that Lancashire County Council are involved with, in order to help make our community better. Here are some of your thoughts.

- Cars carrying out manoeuvres near to school entrances and driving too fast – dangerous for children and parents
- O Support for zebra crossing by school
- O Alley way by school entrance has a very poor surface large puddles, muddy, slippery, doesn't get gritted in the winter so can be very icy, children and parents have fallen over.
- Many large potholes and puddles near to school — bad for mobility scooters, pushchairs, bikes
- Speeding on Park Road and Tremellen
 Street suggestion of speed bumps, one-way streets, or other traffic calming measures
- The Park on Park Road (just north of Mas jid) — needs improvement. Lack of seating and bins around this Park particularly.

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 General lack of bins — this is being discussed separately with the MP and LCC.

These ideas have come from our children.

- Outside school some cars stop on yellow lines
- O Ginnel near school (from traffic light crossing on Park Rd SW to unadopted street muddy, lots of litter and fly tipping, used to be nicer but currently overgrown / wasteland. Suggestion to include lighting (solar), benches, flowers, trees.
- O Unadopted road at north end of Park Rd / Princess St — lots of very large potholes and muddy puddles. Suggestion for improved ped footway, children sign. This route is used by school to walk children to leisure centre.
- O Emma Street surface improvement badly needed. Fly tipping issues. Footway wide but uneven in places. There is an existing path and green space directly next to the sports pitch but this is in poor repair (overgrown, play equipment no longer usable, paths very muddy)

 Suggestion for improved play area, picnic area / benches, flowers, trees.
- O Back alley at south side of school cars use as cut through which is dangerous. Could widen footpaths / narrow the driving space, or make it less straight. Improve pedestrian environment and safety by flattening the cobbles (currently slippery and lots of puddles), putting put posters / artwork (could be designed by children), add benches, add trees/planters. Thank you for your input and ideas; they are much appreciated.

SAFEGUARDING SURVERY WITH OUR CHILDREN

This half term we have carried out a survey to see whether your children feel safe. Here are some of their comments.

The children feel safe because no-one can get in. We have fire alarms. Teachers make us feel safe.
